


Living in God's Grace as a Neighbor to the World




Most merciful God,




1 We know that Christ is raised and dies no more. Embraced by death, he broke its fearful hold, and our despair he turned to blazing joy.




2 We share by water in his saving death. Reborn, we share with him an Easter life, as living members of our Savior Christ. Hallelujah!




3 The Father's splendor clothes the Son with life. The Spirit's fission shakes the church of God. Baptized, we live with God the Three in One.



I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.




Apostles' Creed

As we receive the bread and cup today, we receive grace upon grace from Jesus: forgiveness, new life and salvation.


Come and hold your hands out and receive God's goodness with the holy word of thanks: "Amen!"



Communion Blessing


The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, which you have now received, strengthen you and keep you in God's grace.





Please come join us to help one or more of the Saturdays during the month. This is a very important ministry of the area congregations to reach out to those with food instability.


