Jeff's Jottings – Lutheran Foundations #8: Confession

Following is the eighth and final installment of a series of reflections Pastor Jeff is doing on the basic Lutheran understanding of Christian faith. He is doing these in 2017 as one of the ways we commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation.

On June 25, 1530 Elector John of Saxony led a group of German rulers and representatives of free German cities to Augsburg to present a written account of their religious convictions at an Imperial Diet (gathering) called by the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V. This document became known as the *Augsburg Confession* (or *Augustana*) and is the first of a number of foundational documents for Lutherans.

The Lutheran Church is known as a "confessional" church. This means that what we believe is written down in documents which we call confessions of our faith. Lutherans are very clear about where the authority of faith is to be found: first in the **scriptures**, second in the **Creeds** – the Nicene Creed, the Apostles Creed and the Athanasian Creed – and third in the *Augsburg Confession* and other **confessional documents** contained in the *Book of Concord* (or *Concordia*).

Note the date of the presentation of the *Augsburg Confession*: 1530. It was nearly 13 years after Luther posted the 95 theses on the door in Wittenburg. This time frame should remind us that the Reformation, which resulted in the formation of Lutheran and other Protestant bodies, was not a brief affair. It went on literally for decades. In fact, the name-sake and final confession that went into the *Book of Concord*, the *Formula of Concord*, was not written until 1577, more that three decades after Luther's death and sixty years after the posting of the theses.

Now many of you may not have read the *Augsburg Confession* or *Formula of Concord*. Nor have you read some of the other long confessions from the *Book of Concord* such as *The Smalcald Articles* or the *Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope*. But, believe it or not, you most likely have studied the *Book of Concord*. You see, two documents contained in the *Concordia* are the foundation of Lutheran confirmation: *The Small Catechism* and *The Large Catechism*.

The catechisms are actually the earliest of the documents contained in the *Book of Concord* and are thus the first written doctrine (confessions) of Lutherans. Luther wrote *The Small Catechism* for parents to teach faith to their children. It was designed in question and answer format for the purpose of rote learning through memorization. *The Large Catechism*, follows the same outline as *The Small Catechism*, but offers much deeper and longer explanations of the commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the sacraments. It was written for the edification and instruction of preachers and teachers.

I thank God for the documents of our faith. For it is through these documents that the "communion of saints," which we profess our belief in each week, is made real. For you see, as we read scriptures, we are in conversation with prophets and Psalmists and Apostles, even though they died thousands of years ago. As we confess and study our Creeds, we are in conversation with the very first Christians, some of whom may have walked and talked with the Apostles themselves. And as we study and learn *The Small Catechism* and the *Augsburg Confession*, we are in conversation with Martin Luther, Philipp Melancthon, Justus Jonas, Johannes Bugenhagen and others who called the church, and the world, into a new era 500 years ago.

See you in church on Sunday as we continue our conversation with this great communion of saints!

IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH, COMPTON
COUNCIL MEETING
July 13, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 6:33p by Council President, Randy Schlesinger. Council members in attendance were Diane Englehart, Bob Kromm, Jill Ross, Randy Schlesinger, Scott Schlesinger and Sarah Goetz. Zach Ross and Pastor Jeff Schlesinger were not present.

Bob Kromm opened the meeting with a prayer and led Encountering Scripture by reading Ecclesiastes 3:1-8.

A motion was made by Bob Kromm and seconded by Scott Schlesinger to approve the agenda. The motion carried.

The June minutes were presented for approval. A motion was made by Diane Englehart and seconded by Scott Schlesinger to approve the minutes. The motion carried.

The minutes from the June 25 congregational meeting were also presented. A motion was made by Diane Englehart and seconded by Jill Ross to endorse the June 25 congregational meeting minutes. They will be presented to the congregation at the 2018 annual meeting for approval. The motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

- Pastor Jeff Schlesinger left his monthly report for the Council to review.
- Rev. Carol Soderholm will be the supply pastor on July 16, and Rev. Tammy Anderson is the pastor on call while Pastor Jeff Schlesinger is on vacation.
- Jill Ross and Diane Englehart volunteered to send a sympathy card to Rev. Vicki Sauter on behalf of Immanuel for the passing of her husband.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- The LP contract for the upcoming year was discussed. Last year 5500 gallons were contracted and we used 5500 gallons. Randy Schlesinger will tell Harlan Eames to proceed with the contract for the coming winter. The amount due by August 15 is \$321.41.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Reports for General Treasury, AMDEX Account, Capital Improvement Fund, Memorial Fund, and Benevolence were presented.

- General Treasury ending balance on June 30, 2017 was \$21,242.52
- AMDEX Account ending balance on June 30, 2017 was \$33,635.42
- Capital Improvement Fund ending balance on June 30, 2017 was \$42,355.35
- Memorial Fund ending balance on June 30, 2017 was \$16,949.34
- Benevolence Account ending balance on June 30, 2017 was \$10,774.39

A motion was made by Sarah Goetz and seconded by Bob Kromm to approve the financial reports. The motion carried.

TEAM REPORTS

- Building and Grounds:
 - Recently there was water in the basement that appeared to have come in under the west door when there was a driving rain. Upon further investigation, the tile was plugged, which was then addressed.
 - Jason Foster has completed painting the ceiling in the basement. He will go back to the places he painted earlier where the paint bubbled.
 - Charlene Zimmerman shared with Bob Kromm that the stains on the carpet in the sanctuary are getting worse. Also, some of the pew pads need to be cleaned. Bob Kromm will check with Andy's to see what the price would be for both. Randy Schlesinger said the company that installed the pew pads had a cleaning service they recommended. Randy Schlesinger will check what their price is.
 - Scott Schlesinger asked if the light bulb in the eternal candle needs to be replaced. The team will investigate.

- o Bids have been obtained from three companies for air conditioning in the parsonage. There is a variance in suggested approaches and prices, so the team will continue to work with the companies to get them on the same page so pricing can more fairly be compared.
- o Once a list of recommended improvements for the parsonage is compiled and approved by the Council, a congregational meeting will need to be scheduled. The money used will come out of the Capital Improvement Fund.
- o Windows for the bell tower are ordered.
- Worship: No report
- Hospitality: No report

- Education: No report
- Scholarship:
 - o The team met and distributed a total of \$4,800.00 in scholarships. 6 applications were received this year. The 2 first-time applicants were each given \$950.00. The 4 previous recipients were each given \$725.00.
- Audit: No report
- Parish:
 - o The team met on July 6.
 - o The 5th Sunday on July 30 will include 9:30 worship at Immanuel, the Heart of Illinois Lutheran Parish meeting, packing Christmas boxes for Romania and a cookout.
 - o October 29 is the next 5th Sunday, which is also Reformation Sunday. The team wants to plan a special meal for that day.
 - o Pastor Jeff Schlesinger is considering a parish t-shirt to advertise Immanuel and First being the Heart of Illinois Lutheran Parish.
 - o The 5th Sundays for 2018 were discussed, as were 3-year terms for the Parish team.
 - o The 2017 Christmas schedule is set. Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year. There will be the regular 8:30a and 10:30a Sunday morning services. There will also be a Christmas Eve service at 7:00p at Immanuel and 9:00p at First. On Christmas Day, there will be a 10:00a service at Immanuel. December 31 is a 5th Sunday, but since it is New Year's Eve the congregations will follow their normal 8:30a and 10:30a services rather than having a joint service. There will be a Thanksgiving Eve service at 7:00p at Immanuel.
- Memorial:
 - o Minor Avery met with Bonnie Jenkins and her husband, and they shared they would like to support the entire sacristy project. The project is almost complete. The cost to this point is \$12,111.52 plus Jason Foster's expenses.

A motion was made by Scott Schlesinger and seconded by Diane Englehart to approve the team reports. The motion carried.

LYO REPORT – No report

OLD BUSINESS

- Business Mileage/Leased Car – Scott Schlesinger will follow up with Pastor Jeff Schlesinger to see if he has a preference in cars and then do more research.
- New Council Member – Bob Kromm shared that Charlene Zimmerman expressed interest in being on the Council. A motion was made by Bob Kromm and seconded by Scott Schlesinger to appoint Charlene Zimmerman to join Council to complete Bob Eich's term. The motion carried. Bob Kromm will let Charlene Zimmerman know.
- Parsonage – The topic was covered in the Building and Grounds report.
- God's Work Our Hands – Randy Schlesinger said the mulch has been delivered to the park in Lee. It should not be a large job to complete. We will also be doing some painting. Randy Schlesinger will announce the date once it is set.

NEXT MEETING

The next meeting is Thursday, August 10, 2017 at 6:30p.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Jill Ross and seconded by Diane Englehart. The motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:03p and closed with the Lord's Prayer.
