Jeff's Jottings: Dwelling/Abiding

As we work through the good news of Jesus as told by John this summer, it is very clear that there are some key concepts John wants to convey to us regarding Jesus. First and foremost, John wants to emphasize that he wrote everything down for the purpose of belief:

*For God so loved the world that he gave his only son, so that whoever **believes** in him will not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16)*

*Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to **believe** that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through **believing** you may have life in his name. (John 20:30-31)*

As I have said many times during our journey through John's gospel, to believe is more than a simple cognitive act. In other words, it is much more than simply to know who Jesus is. Essentially, when we read the word *believe* in John's gospel, we could substitute the phrase *to have faith*:

...so that whoever *believes* *has faith* in him will not perish but have eternal life.

... these are written so that you may come to *believe* *have faith* that Jesus is the Messiah....

So one of the key questions in John is to figure out what it means to believe – or to have faith. The primary way in which John describes faith is with the word *abide* (the same Greek word is also translated as *dwell, live, stay, remain* or *continue*). To believe in Jesus is to *abide* with him. To have faith is to *abide* in his word.

This means that the good news (or gospel) that John proclaims is that the Word has become flesh to *abide* with us, and we in turn are to *abide* with that Word. Our relationship with God is a two way street. God never gives up on us, but continues to dwell among us. Neither should we give up on God, but rather continue to dwell with God.

So what does this mean? What does it mean to *abide* with Jesus? The first sense of that has to do with presence. If you live with someone, that means you are in their presence on a regular, everyday basis. Thus, things like saying a simple little meal prayer both calls on God's presence and let's God know that we are present with God. Luther taught us to begin our day by splashing ourselves with water and making the sign of the cross on ourselves, thus reminding us that through our baptism we are made children of God and that we live with God each and every day.

Jesus said, "If you *abide* in my word, you are truly my disciples" (John 8:31). If we allow ourselves to reduce the concept of belief to just "knowledge," we miss the ongoing life that discipleship has to offer. But the truth of *abiding* as a mark of discipleship compels us to put ourselves in the presence of Jesus' word. And so we *abide* in his word as we gather together for worship – to sing that word, to hear that word read and preached, to receive the saving word of forgiveness, and to eat and drink that word in the blessed sacrament. Jesus did not come so that you would know in your head who he is, but he came so that you might *abide* with and in him and have abundant life through him, doing so in community with all those others who have come to believe in him as the Messiah, the Son of God.

So let us all *abide* with Jesus, and let us do that together. I'll see you in church on Sunday.

For the third consecutive year, we will be celebrating "Season of Creation" at Heart of Illinois Lutheran Parish. Utilizing the work of some renowned theologians, the liturgy and lessons will focus around God's grand creation and our place in it.

This optional liturgical season maps out a four week "season of creation" for each of the three years of the lectionary cycle. This year's season (year B in the lectionary) includes the following themes and lessons:



September 30: Earth Sunday – Genesis 1:1-25; Psalm 33:1-8; Romans 1:18-23; John 1:1-14

October 7: Humanity Sunday – Genesis 1:26-28; Psalm 8; Philippians 2:1-8; Mark 10:41-45

October 14: Sky Sunday – Jeremiah 4:23-28; Psalm 19:1-8; Philippians 2:14-18; Mark 15:33-39

October 21: Mountain & Hill Sunday – Isaiah 65:17-25; Psalm 48:1-11; Romans 8:28-39; Mark 16:14-18

IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH, COMPTON
COUNCIL MEETING
July 12, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:26p by Council President, Bob Kromm. Council members in attendance were Brad Ehlers, Diane Englehart, Bob Kromm, Pastor Jeff Schlesinger, Scott Schlesinger, Charlene Zimmerman and Sarah Goetz. Kayla McCormick and Jill Ross were absent.

Pastor Jeff Schlesinger opened the meeting with a prayer. Scott Schlesinger led Encountering Scripture by reading Romans 12: 9-21, focusing on building each other up and working together.

A motion was made by Charlene Zimmerman and seconded by Brad Ehlers to approve the agenda. The motion carried.

The June minutes were presented for approval. A motion was made by Pastor Jeff Schlesinger and seconded by Diane Englehart to approve the minutes as presented. The motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

- A sermon series and Bible study focusing on John will begin in July.
- Pastor Jeff Schlesinger will be on vacation July 30 – August 7. Reverend Chris Stienstra will be the supply pastor on August 5.
- The Discovering Hope Conference is a conference for congregations with small memberships. It is Saturday, October 6, in Washington, IL. Pastor Jeff Schlesinger is encouraging both Immanuel and First to participate. A motion was made by Diane Englehart and seconded by Charlene Zimmerman to fund the registration fee for the Discovering Hope Conference. The motion carried.
- Pastor Jeff Schlesinger and Bob Kromm discussed the importance of our relationship with First and would like to see us continuing to share back and forth frequently.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Reports for General Treasury, AMDEX Account, Capital Improvement Fund, Memorial Fund and Benevolence were presented.

- General Treasury ending balance on June 30, 2018 was \$1,163.15
- AMDEX Account ending balance on June 30, 2018 was \$29,711.42
- Capital Improvement Fund ending balance on June 30, 2018 was \$40,931.96
- Memorial Fund ending balance on June 30, 2018 was \$18,962.68
- Benevolence Account ending balance on June 30, 2018 was \$10,821.85

Charlene Zimmerman presented a couple of handouts. The first outlined the past eight years of giving versus expenses. The trends are negative. We are running a 10% deficit from the budget. We don't have a lot of extra expenses beyond the necessities, so there aren't a lot of areas that can be cut. The second handout was a list of each of the financial accounts and where they are located. A question was asked if the Capital Improvement Fund can have checks written directly out of it rather than money needing to be transferred into the General Treasury to pay capital expenses.

Charlene Zimmerman has updated Portico with Pastor Jeff Schlesinger's status change to full-time.

With Pastor Jeff Schlesinger now living in the parsonage, Harlan Eames inquired if First will be contributing toward the parsonage bills. At the last joint council meeting, First said they would pay 33%. Going forward, electric and LP bills will be split so First will be giving their figure for 33% to pay.

Usually at this time of the year we take a withdrawal from the Farm Account and make a payment to the Synod. Charlene Zimmerman will contact Keith Zoeller to have a check cut.

A motion was made by Pastor Jeff Schlesinger and seconded by Charlene Zimmerman to approve the financial reports. The motion carried.

TEAM REPORTS

- **Building and Grounds:**
 - The parsonage project was successfully completed within budget.
 - The team would like to keep the momentum going. They will be selecting their next project. Possibilities include the parking lot and landscaping.
 - Jason Foster agreed to join the Building and Grounds Team.
- **Worship:** No report
- **Farm:** No report
- **Education:** No report
- **Scholarship:**
 - The team met on July 12.
 - \$3,245.00 is available to distribute in scholarships this year. The team recommends the six first-time applicants each receive \$320.00 and the other six applicants receive \$220.00 each. A motion was made by Charlene Zimmerman and seconded by Sarah Goetz to approve the team's recommendation for scholarship distributions. The motion carried.
 - An exception was made to the scholarship guidelines this year, so the two students going to Lutheran colleges are receiving the same amount as the other recipients.
 - The team is reviewing current policies and suggested changes. Once complete, they will be brought to the Council to approve.
- **Audit :** No report
- **Parish:**
 - The team met on July 10.
 - The next 5th Sunday worship is July 29. It will be held at First with a picnic following.
 - The Joint Mission Sub Group for Another Child Foundation completed their first project during VBS. The VBS children created a banner for Romanian Bible School students titled "Jesus Loves You" in Romanian. They also collected and sent Bible School supplies with the banner.
 - The next team meeting will be September 6 at Immanuel.
- **Memorial:** No report.

A motion was made by Diane Englehart and seconded by Brad Ehlers to approve the team reports. The motion carried.

LYO REPORT -

- The group will be sharing their experiences from the Houston gathering in church next Sunday.

OLD BUSINESS -

- Tiling: We anticipate a \$10,000.00 expense for the tiling. Charlene Zimmerman shared a handout with the last five years of farm reports. A couple of suggestions to cover the expenditure included skipping the 20% distribution to the Capital Improvement fund for one year or borrowing money from the New Building Fund and then gradually paying it back from the Farm account. The guidelines of the Florschuetz fund were reviewed, but it is not intended for farm expenses. August 19 was decided on for a congregational meeting.

NEW BUSINESS - None

NEXT MEETING

The next meeting is Thursday, August 9, 2018 at 6:30p.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Diane Englehart and seconded by Scott Schlesinger. The motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:54p and closed with the Lord's Prayer.
